*Download the DCPS 24-25 Calendar for scheduled holidays, teacher planning days, weather days, and Early Release Wednesdays **Student enrollment** - Please provide a copy of student's birth certificate, current immunizations, and health records at the start of school. Administration must receive these documents by August 16th for the student to return back to school on August 19th.

Scholarship, tuition, and fees - Check your email quarterly to digitally sign for the school to receive funds. You may be responsible for additional fees not covered by the SUFS scholarship(s). Payment for additional tuition and fees is available online via school website (www.parkwood.school) and on the Gradelink desktop website (not available on the mobile app).

Before and After care - Parkwood Prep offers extended school care for students in all grade levels who need care beyond the normal school hours. Please email weecspeed@gmail.com to request extended care for an additional fee. Fees will also be assessed if a student is not on the extended care list and is picked up after 3:15pm.

Student attendance - Students are expected to arrive at school on time. Any student arriving after 9:15am must be checked-in at the Church Office and is considered tardy. Five (5) tardies is equal to one (1) unexcused absence. Five (5) unexcused absences will result in a parent meeting and scholarship risk. Students may be picked up for early dismissal at the Church Office BEFORE 2:30PM; early dismissal will be denied between 2:30pm -3:00pm at which point authorized adults are required to wait to pick up the student until school is released at 3pm.

School visitors - If you plan to visit your child for lunch or have a meeting at the school, please check-in/check-out at the Church Office and wear a visitor badge.

SHOFS

Any shoes with heel straps from any retailer; No flip-flops or Crocs Reminder: all students are walking up- and down-stairs every day they are at school; please be mindful of their safety and comfort

Students are expected to arrive at school in uniform attire. If a student is dropped off without appropriate uniform clothes, the parents will be contacted to bring them a proper uniform.

- All clothing must be single-solid colors without rips, tears, stripes, or patterns
- Any Parkwood apparel is acceptable school uniform attire
- Uniforms are optional for Special Occasions (student birthday, classroom holiday party, dress up days and special events)
- All clothing must meet the minimum requirements for DCPS standard Dress Code.

Students can dress down every Wednesday for \$1 (or more)! Teachers will collect cash from participating students at the beginning of the school day.

The purpose of this policy is to ensure the health, safety, and well-being of our students while also minimizing the disruption to the educational process.

Florida Law and the Department of Education requires all students to provide documentation of (1) immunization records, (2) a health examination form completed by your child's pediatrician, and (3) a copy of the birth certificate before the school year begins. Please provide a copy of each listed document by August 16, 2024 in order for your child to return to school on August 19, 2024.

A student who is showing signs of illness or running a fever should be kept at home. When the school determines a student sick, parents will be contacted and MUST pick up their child within 45 minutes of notification. Failure to pick up a sick student within this time frame may result in a late fee. Parkwood staff has full discretion as to a student's ability to remain on campus.



Stay at home if your child has any of the following symptoms: Fever above 100°F, vomiting, diarrhea, rash, eye discharge, and/or other general symptoms of onset illness



Return to school when your child is symptom-free for 24 hours without medication. If any student has been absent for 3 or more consecutive days, you must provide a physician's note exempting his or her absence from school.
